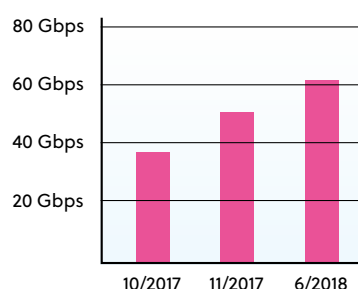
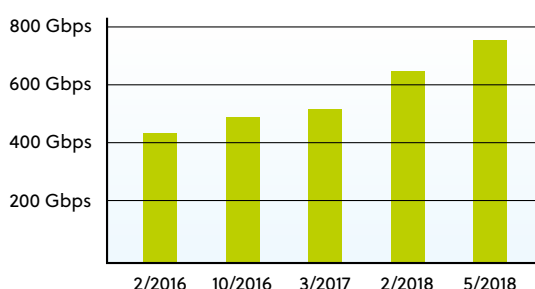

## New data transfer records for NIX.CZ and NIX.SK

The last three months saw a shift in the maximum data transfers values in both peering nodes operated by NIX.CZ.

For the Czech node the current record speed is 731.9 Gb/s, for the Slovak node it is 60.5 Gb/s.
